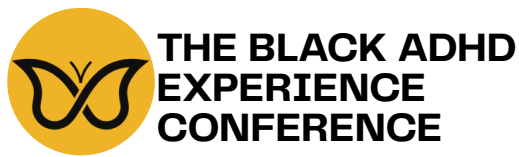

Letter from the Founder

Dear Community Partners,

As a late-diagnosed Autistic and ADHD mother raising one Autistic learner and one ADHD learner, and as the spouse of an ADHDer, I understand both personally and professionally how important it is for ADHD support to reflect the whole person.

As awareness and understanding of ADHD continue to grow, one essential part of the conversation is too often overlooked: intersectionality.

Black individuals with ADHD may navigate the combined impact of ableism, racism, cultural misunderstanding, delayed identification, misdiagnosis, disciplinary responses to perceived “behavior,” and limited access to culturally responsive, affirming support. These experiences can affect every stage of the journey, from recognizing possible ADHD and accessing an evaluation to receiving meaningful support at home, in school, in therapeutic settings, in relationships, and throughout the community.

I created **The Black ADHD Experience Conference** because Black ADHDers, families, caregivers, educators, clinicians, advocates, and community members deserve a space where these realities are not treated as an afterthought. They deserve conversations that center culture, identity, lived experience, access, and dignity.

This first-of-its-kind conference will bring these conversations together in an intentionally Black-centered, culturally responsive, neuroaffirming, and anti-ableist space. Our goal is to move beyond one-size-fits-all approaches and explore what meaningful support can look like across education, mental health, relationships, parenting, family life, and community care.

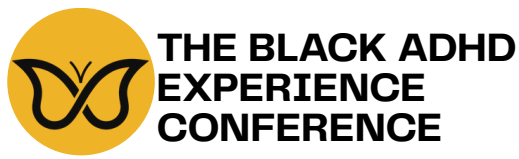

Conference Overview

The Black ADHD Experience Conference is a first-of-its-kind virtual conference created to center the lived experiences, needs, and strengths of Black individuals with ADHD across the lifespan.

Taking place **October 2–4, 2026**, the conference will bring together Black ADHDers, parents and caregivers, educators, mental health professionals, advocates, service providers, and community members for three days of culturally responsive, neuroaffirming, and anti-ableist learning and connection.

The conference was developed in response to a critical gap in many ADHD conversations: the limited attention given to intersectionality. Black individuals with ADHD may experience delayed identification, misdiagnosis, racialized interpretations of behavior, disproportionate discipline, barriers to care, and support approaches that do not fully consider culture, identity, family, community, or lived experience.

Through presentations, panels, and community-centered discussions, attendees will explore how ADHD can affect education, mental health, relationships, parenting, family life, and access to support. Sessions will emphasize practical strategies, lived experience, advocacy, and approaches that move beyond compliance and deficit-based thinking.

Conference Focus Areas

The conference will include three primary tracks:

Education, IEPs, 504 Plans, and Advocacy

Supporting Black ADHD learners through culturally responsive and neuroaffirming educational practices, meaningful accommodations, effective advocacy, and a deeper understanding of how race and disability influence school experiences.

Mental Health and Wellness

Exploring diagnosis, misdiagnosis, masking, burnout, emotional regulation, trauma, identity, access to affirming care, and the importance of culturally responsive mental health support.

Relationships, Parenting, and Family Life

Addressing the impact of ADHD within couples, parenting, caregiving, family relationships, communication, household responsibilities, and intergenerational experiences.

Use-of-funds statement: Access Sponsor contributions will be directed toward registration access, replay access, accessibility supports, or other conference-related access needs as determined by the conference organizer.

IN-KIND SPONSOR – APPROVED GOODS OR SERVICES

Description

An in-kind contribution does not automatically include exclusivity, naming rights, prerecorded messaging, or every benefit offered within a monetary sponsorship tier.

In-Kind Sponsors must provide:

- Description of the proposed product or service
- Estimated fair market value
- Quantity, scope, or number of service hours
- Anticipated delivery or completion date
- Any limitations, restrictions, or expiration dates
- Shipping, delivery, or access requirements
- Logo and website information, when recognition applies

All in-kind contributions must be approved in writing before goods or services are provided.

Sponsorship Guidelines

To protect the integrity of the conference and the attendee experience, all sponsorships and promotional materials are subject to the following guidelines:

- Sponsorship does not provide control over speakers, sessions, or conference content.
- Sponsor materials must align with the conference's culturally responsive, neuroaffirming, and anti-ableist values.
- All advertisements, resources, videos, and promotional materials require approval.
- Sponsorship does not represent an endorsement of every product or service offered by the sponsor.
- Materials promoting harmful, discriminatory, compliance-based, or cure-oriented practices may be declined.
- Logos and promotional materials must be submitted by the stated deadline.
- Sponsorship payments are nonrefundable after benefits or promotional services have begun. Approved in-kind contributions are also subject to the terms of the contribution agreement.
- Competitor exclusivity is not included unless specifically negotiated in writing.

In-Kind Sponsorships are not confirmed until the proposed contribution has been reviewed and approved in writing.

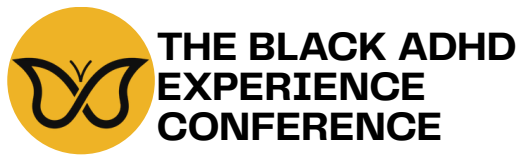
Sponsorship Levels

- **Community Sponsor** — \$250
- **Access Sponsor** — Flexible Contribution; recognition benefits begin at \$100
- **In-Kind Sponsor** — Approved Goods or Services

Payment and Contribution Deadlines

Community and Access Sponsor payments are due by September 18, 2026, to ensure inclusion in applicable conference materials and sponsor recognition.

In-Kind Sponsorship proposals and delivery terms should be approved by September 4, 2026, unless otherwise agreed in writing.



Payment Process

Once the sponsorship type has been selected, an invoice or contribution agreement will be provided when applicable.

Community and Access Sponsorship benefits are not confirmed until required payment has been received. In-Kind Sponsorship benefits are not confirmed until the contribution agreement has been approved and the delivery terms have been accepted.

Refund and Cancellation Policy

Community Sponsor payments are nonrefundable once promotional benefits, resource placement, registrations, or other sponsor services have begun.

Access Sponsor contributions are nonrefundable once funds have been allocated toward attendee access, replay access, accessibility supports, or other approved conference needs.

If a sponsor cancels before benefits have been provided or funds have been allocated, any refund or credit will be determined by the conference organizer based on completed work and expenses already incurred.

If the conference is canceled by the organizer, sponsors will be offered a refund, credit, or another mutually agreed-upon option.

Tax Information

Sponsorship payments are made to Destiny Huff Consulting, LLC and should not be represented as charitable donations unless otherwise stated in writing.

Sponsors should consult their tax or financial professional regarding whether sponsorship expenses may qualify as advertising, marketing, or business expenses.
